GRILLED AVOCADO CAPRESE SALAD

½ cup olive oil
4 cloves garlic minced
Kosher salt & pepper
2 avocados
1 pint grape tomatoes halved
16 Bocconcini small mozzarella balls,
halved
Fresh Basil, chopped
Balsamic Glaze

In a small bowl combine the oil, garlic, Kosher salt & pepper. Stir it up and allow it to mingle for at least 1 hour.

Prep your tomatoes and mozzarella, season with salt & pepper. 30 minutes before serving, toss them with some of the garlic oil.

Oil & heat your grill. Halve your avocados. Season and brush liberally with the garlic oil. Place each avocado half face down on your hot grill and grill for 4-5 minutes (leave the lid open). You are just looking for some nice char marks and for the avocado to be heated through.

Remove avocados and plate them. Toss in the basil with the tomato & mozzarella mixture, mix it up. and spoon it into and over-top the avocados, drizzle with balsamic glaze & dig in!



BASIC INGREDIENTS:

- Longos tomato & Basil pasta sauce
- Shredded pizza mozzarella
- 10 pack Nann bread

Heat the grill to 400°F Coat each piece of Nann in sauce and cheese. Add your favourite toppings. Cook for 5-6 minutes until melty and a bit crispy.

Serving an impromptu crowd? Grab some charcuterie boards and cut them up to share.

- Canned pineapple
- Sliced pepperoni
- Mini peppers sliced in disks

TOPPINGS FOR THE ADULTS:

Mexican Street Cour

6 to 8 medium ears of sweet corn, husks removed

1/2 cup sour cream or crema

1/2 cup mayonnaise

1/2 cup chopped cilantro

1 clove garlic, minced

1/4 teaspoon ground chipotle pepper, or powder

2 teaspoons finely grated lime zest, from 1 lime

2 tablespoons lime juice, from 1 lime

1/2 cup cotija cheese, crumbled

Lime wedges, to serve

Heat the grill to 400°F

Whisk together the crema or sour cream, mayonnaise, cilantro, garlic, chipotle pepper, lime zest, and lime juice. Season with salt if needed.

Grill the corn: Place the husked corn directly onto grill grates. Grill the corn for about 3 minutes, turn over and repeat. When all sides are browned, remove from the grill onto a plate.





LIGHT UP THE NIGHT WITH THESE LANDSCAPE LIGHTING TIPS



PLAN AND DESIGN:

- 1. Start by creating a lighting plan for your landscape. Identify the key focal points, such as trees, architectural features, pathways, or water features that you want to highlight.
- 2. Consider the overall ambiance you want to create, whether it's soft and romantic or bright and functional.
- 3. Use a mix of lighting techniques, such as uplighting, downlighting, and accent lighting, to add depth and dimension to your landscape.

CHOOSE THE RIGHT FIXTURES:

- 1. Select high-quality fixtures that are designed for outdoor use and can withstand the elements.
- 2. Opt for fixtures with adjustable features, such as beam angle and intensity, to have flexibility in lighting different areas.
- 3. Consider energy-efficient options, such as LED lights, which are long-lasting and consume less electricity.

HIGHLIGHT KEY FEATURES:

CONSIDER LIGHTING TECHNIQUES:

- 1. Use silhouetting by placing a light behind an object to create a striking silhouette effect against a wall or fence.
- 2. Create shadowing effects by placing lights in front of textured surfaces, such as stone walls or trellises, to cast interesting shadows.
- 3. Experiment with colored filters or lenses to add ambiance or to match a specific theme or occasion.

USE LAYERS AND ZONES:

- 1. Create depth and visual interest by layering different lighting elements, such as combining uplighting with path lighting and accent lighting.
- 2. Divide your landscape into zones and use separate circuits or controls to adjust lighting levels in each zone independently. This allows you to create different moods and accommodate different activities.

INSTALL PROPER WIRING AND CONTROLS:

Whether you're starting from scratch, adding a feature to existing landscaping, or updating a current structure, outdoor living can transform the way you use your backyard. We asked our Timber Craft team to chime in on all things structures and they were all too eager to share their thoughts.

DEFINING THE PURPOSE OF YOUR OUTDOOR LIVING SPACE


Your planned use of the space should be your primary focus. Clarify the intended function to guide your design and construction decisions. This understanding should consider the specific needs of the people using the space, the activities that will take place within it, and any constraints that may impact its use.



COSTS & BUDGET

While many people consider the costs of the structure and the elements you can see, the finishes and furniture, the foundation is the most important part, and that expense is often overlooked.

For example, services such as gas, electrical or plumbing may be required depending on the items selected for your new structure. Are you planning an outdoor kitchen? Do you need to upgrade your power? Do you want wifi? A washroom? Keep in mind that most of these services require trenching. These additional costs can add up quickly, so make sure you're being realistic with your budget and plan and account for these details.



OPTIONS FOR STRUCTURES

Once your vision is clear, you can move on to the implementation and planning of your structure.

The functionality of your structure can vary from a simple change room and storage area to a complete outdoor entertainment space.

Different companies may refer to structures a bit differently. There are basic rules for defining a structure, but customizations and unique designs are what we're all about, so we're going to give you the following Timber Craft Structure
Terminology to break down different types of structures.



PERGOLAS

A pergola is made of posts or pillars, with cross beams and an open top design. It may be a stand alone structure, or an extension off of a building, deck or terrace. They usually provide a bit of a break from the heat by providing some shade, and help define a space. Often used for outdoor kitchen spaces because it is best for ventilation. They are also great for hanging lights or growing vines!



PAVILIONS

Unlike pergolas, pavilions feature a completely closed roof. At Timber Craft, we design our pavilions to rest on either a patio (with poured footings underneath) or poured foundation. Our Pavilions often feature a back wall, with open sides. Project Gar Lehman (pictured above) is a classic pavilion. Clients love to personalize these spaces, and they are a favourite spot to entertain!



CABANAS

Typically a cabana is a more enclosed structure (2 sided or more) designed for living space. It has a completely closed roof, and can range in size. Often featuring a fireplace, an eating area or bar, a seated entertaining area, and a washroom or change room. Some even opt for a sauna! Cabanas are an excellent option if you have the space, and entertain often.

Something to take note of: Any structure larger than 10×10 requires a permit. We build opulent structures with all the bells and whistles like project Sofia pictured above.

MULTI-FUNCTIONING SHEDS

Sheds are fully enclosed, one story structures, with a one pitch roof. They range in size, but are typically under 10×10. Although they have historically been used for storage, we have been getting a lot of requests lately for insulated sheds that are being converted into offices, home gyms, even indoor golf simulators. Sheds can easily be 4 season structures and become extensions of your home.

SUMMER POLLEN CAN MEAN PROBLEMS

Pollen in your pool can lead to clogged filters and cloudy water.

Pollen particles are typically very small and can easily pass through the pool's filtration system. This means the pollen may remain suspended in the water for longer periods, making it difficult to remove through filtration. As a result, your pool's filtration system may need to work harder or be cleaned more frequently to keep the water clear.

Pollen can also act as a food source for algae, turning water green and making balancing your water difficult. It's important to stay on top of it before it becomes a problem.

HELPFUL TIPS:

- Skim the surface of your pool using a fine mesh skimmer
- 2. Add a skimmer sock to your skimmer basket
- 3. Check filters for collected debris & pollen regularly
- 4. If you have a spare set of cartridges on hand for openings, pop them in for those weeks in the summer when pollen is strongest

IF IT BECOMES A PROBLEM:

If pollen becomes a problem purchase the necessary tools to clean your cartridges.

Add a bottle of First Aid to the water, wait 24-48 hours, vacuum to waste and then shock.

SPILL OVER OR STAND ALONE?

Maintaining the temperature of either option at around 95 degrees will extend your spa time, giving you hours of enjoyment instead of overheating.

Both spill-over spas and stand-alone spas have their advantages and disadvantages. Let's explore the pros and cons of each:

SPILL-OVER SPA:

PRO'S

- 1. Aesthetics: Spill-over spas are visually appealing as they are designed to seamlessly integrate with an existing swimming pool. They create a unified and elegant look, enhancing the overall appearance of your pool area.
- 2. Space-saving: Since a spill-over spa is built into the pool, it doesn't require additional space. This can be beneficial if you have limited space in your backyard.
- 3. Convenience: With a spill-over spa, you can easily transition from the spa to the pool or vice versa, providing a convenient and enjoyable experience.



CONS:

- 1. Limited customization: Spill-over spas often have limited customization options compared to stand-alone spas. You may have fewer choices in terms of size, shape, and features.
- 2. Cost: The construction of a spill-over spa can be more expensive than a stand-alone spa due to the additional plumbing and integration required.
- 3. Seasonality: Spill-over spas need to be closed for the winter along with your pool because they share a plumbing source.

STAND-ALONE SPA:

PROS:


